Applications are available on the Epsilon Sigma Alpha International (ESA) website. The application must be completed online via the ESA application system. The following supporting documents must be uploaded to the online application: a signed transcript that includes current grade point average, an explanation of the school's grading system, and SAT/ACT documentation (may be included as separate document); two letters of recommendation; and a personal essay that discusses career plans, reasons for applying to the scholarship, reasons the student should be selected for the scholarship, the student's leadership and service accomplishments, and any additional information that is not included in the application. Please note: The student must select the scholarship(s) for which he/she wishes to apply and add them to his/her application "cart". The student must pay a \$5 application fee for each scholarship for which he/she wishes to apply. Scholarship applications must be submitted by 11:00 p.m. MST on the deadline date.

## HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS SCHOLARSHIPS

### McDonalds Scholarship

In addition to the McDonald's National Employees Scholarship, RMHC offers four distinct types of McDonalds scholarships to the public:

1. RMHC/ Scholars (a need-based award open to all deserving and talented students regardless of their race, creed, color or heritage).
2. RMHC/Asia (for applicants with at least one parent of Asian-Pacific heritage).
3. RMHC/African-American Future Achievers (for applicants with at least one parent of African-American or Black-Caribbean heritage).
4. RMHC/HACER (for applicants with at least one parent of Hispanic/Latino heritage).

The number and the amount of all the McDonalds scholarships are determined by the local participating chapters. They are typically a minimum of \$1000.00 each, and they are usually non-renewable.

Additionally, RMHC/HACER awards four \$100,000 national scholarships. This specific scholarship pays \$25,000 per year towards the 4 years of the student's undergraduate studies.

### McDonalds Scholarships Requirements

The McDonalds scholarship (RMHC scholarship) is available to qualified high school students who live in the United States and meet the following general requirements:

1. Are a legal resident of the U.S.
2. Live in a geographic area where there is a participating RMHC Chapter
3. Are a senior in high school, with a minimum GPA of 2.7
4. Are under the age of 21
5. Are eligible and plan to attend either an accredited two-year or an accredited four-year college or university or technical school, on a full-time basis.

### McDonalds Scholarship Application

The McDonalds scholarship applications are available online from around October 1 and due in December or January.

1. Qualified student applicants must submit a complete application and supply all required documents by the application deadline.

**Kohl's scholarship** is officially called the Kohl's Cares Scholarship Program, and previously was known as KWC or Kohl's Kids Who Care Scholarship Program. It is one of the popular private scholarships for college. Recently over 37,000 applications were received.

Kohl's department stores offers this scholarship for students in two age groups: ages 6 – 12 and ages 13 – 18 who have not yet graduated from high school, based upon outstanding community service during the last 12 months (e.g. March 2015 - March 2016).

Academic achievement and financial need are not considered.
